Strength in partnerships

- Asset-based and co-productive approach that recognises and builds on collective strengths and abilities
- > The council's approach as an enabler and supporter
- Communities and non-statutory partners can act with pace and flexibility e.g. PCSN response to COVID, and leverage resources that are not available to statutory bodies
- The council can bring resources such as additional capacity, specific areas of expertise and raise the profile of community priorities
- Takes time to build trust and relationships!

- Whose outcomes are being defined? And by who? People & Communities Vs Services and Organisations
- Toolkit qualitative and quantitative methodologies
 - Most Significant Change in conjunction with Swansea University
 - Causal mapping led by Together for Change
- Learning from successes & mistakes, and sharing that learning



Future plans / opportunities

- Pembrokeshire Community Hub Future model solutions not services
- Roll out the <u>Connect Pembrokeshire</u> platform
- Pembrokeshire Community Fund investing in communities
- Finalise and implement the Pembrokeshire Volunteering Strategy
- Strengthen relationships with Town & Community Councils and county councillors
- Expand the Community Connector team work with health, Integrated Community Networks, social/blue/green prescribing
- Consider gaps in Community Development

Future plans / opportunities

- Work with Together for Change to further develop the evidence base and evaluation methodologies e.g. SROI, Continuous Engagement Framework
- Expand this approach beyond social care so that it becomes a cross-cutting priority across all directorates, building on work to date
 - Library transfer Narberth
 - Community hall transfer Hubberston & Hakin
 - Series of films showcasing community action across the county
 - Foodbanks working alongside Community Hub
 - Employee volunteering scheme
- Develop cross-directorate strategic approach to preventions across the council
- Establish Pembrokeshire as an exemplar county for community-led action and co-production
